THE OPENING OF THE DOORS

The congregation and minister gather outside the church

P: Let the doors of this church be opened for the preaching of the saving Word of God in accordance with the confessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, for the administration of the holy Sacraments according to the institution of Christ, and for offering to God the sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen.**

The doors are opened

P: Peace be to this house and to all who enter here in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen.**

*As we enter the church the choir sings "Sanctus".
Remain standing.*

THE BLESSING OF THE CHURCH

P: Beloved in the Lord, Christ Jesus is present wherever His holy Word is taught purely, and the holy Sacraments are administered according to His institution. As the Lord said through Moses, "*In every place where I make My name known I shall come to you and bless you*" (Exodus 20:24b).

P: Let us pray.

Almighty and most merciful God, though You are not contained in houses built by human hands, we pray that You will be pleased to dwell with us here and to make known to us Your glory. Be present in this place where we are gathered to receive Your forgiveness, hear Your holy Word, and praise Your holy name. Graciously hear the prayers we shall offer to You; bless the marriages to be solemnised; comfort those who will mourn; and let

harmony and peace rest upon all in this place. Bring us at last to the heavenly Jerusalem, where the Lamb is the Temple, that we may unite with all the saints and angels in His praise; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **C: Amen.**

BLESSING OF THE PULPIT

P: Our Lord Jesus Christ preached and taught repentance and the forgiveness of sins, and after His resurrection, sent His disciples out, saying: *“Go into the entire world and preach the Good News to the whole creation!”* Mark 16:15

Let us pray.

P: O Lord God, Your Son stepped into Simon Peter's boat and from it taught the crowds, thus making it a pulpit. Bless this pulpit that from it Your saving and merciful Word may be proclaimed and many may be brought to eternal salvation; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **C: Amen.**

P: The Lord Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, bless this pulpit. **C: Amen.**

THE INVOCATION

P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

THE CONFESSION

P: Dear friends in Christ: Let us draw near to God our Father with a true heart to confess our sins, and ask Him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.

Remain standing

P: Our help is in the name of the Lord. **C: He made heaven and earth.**

P: I said, I will confess my sins to the Lord. **C: Then He forgave the guilt of my sin.**

P: Almighty God, our Maker and Redeemer, we confess to You that by nature we are sinful and unclean, and that we have sinned against You by thought, word and deed. Therefore we flee for refuge to your infinite mercy and plead for Your grace for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ.

C: Most merciful God, You have given Your only Son to die for us: Have mercy on us, and for His sake grant us forgiveness of all our sins. By Your Holy Spirit increase our knowledge of You and Your will, and make us obedient to Your Word, so that by Your grace we may come to eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

P: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy on us, and has given His only Son to die for us, and for His sake forgives us all our

sins. To those who believe in His name He has given the right to become the children of God and has given them His Holy Spirit. He who believes and is baptised will be saved. Grant this, Lord, to us all. Amen.

THE INTROIT
